Acampe praemorsa var. longepedunculata

Synonym: Acampe rigida Photographed in cultivation



Acampe praemorsa var. longepedunculata grows as a lithophyte—on rocks—or as an epiphyte, in shady forests. One other species in the same genus in Sri Lanka is an epiphyte, growing on trees. A. praemorsa flowers are similar to those of the variety longepedunculata, but the latter variety produces clusters of flowers on long, branching spikes; A. praemorsa, on the other hand, bears its flower clusters on short, unbranched, spikes. The flowers of *Acampe ochracea* are smaller, fewer, and distantly placed.
